SERVICE PLANNED ON MEMORIAL DAY AT EAST SCHODACK

Communities of Southern Part of County To Remember War Dead With Patriotic Program Friday.

Communities of southern Rensselaer County will honor their war dead with Memorial Day exercises Friday at 10:45 a.m. in Woodlawn Cemetery, East Schodack.

Sponsored jointly by Castleton Post, American Legion, and the Men's Club of East Schodack Lutheran Church, the program will

open at 10 a.m. with a procession from the church's recreation hall to the cemetery.

School children, escorted by Boy Scouts, will decorate the graves of soldiers during the cemetery service, where memorial rites will include prayers, readings, band selections, presentation and massing of colors with a salute and the pledge of allegiance, and a firing squad salute and sounding of taps.

The invocation will be given by Rev. Edward Ton, Legion chaplain of Castleton. Rev. Morris Rosenbium will read Psalm 46 of the Scripture and Rev. Alfred Patton of Castleton will read Lincoln's "Gettysburg Address." Rev. Harry W. Lammond, pastor of Trinity Lutheran Church, West Sand Lake, will deliver the address, "In Memoriam." Rev. R. J. Van Deusen of Poeshtenkill will pronounce the benediction.

Marching in the procession will be legionnaires and Legion Auxilliary members, Girl Scouts of Castleton, East Greenbush, East Schodack and Nassau, Juvenile Grange members of East Greenbush, Boy

Scouts of Troop 66, Nassau; Troop 53, Castleton, Troop 57, East Greenbush, and Troop 83, Schodack Landing, and pupils from schools at East Schodack, Brockway, Schodack Center, Miller Road, Clarke Chapel, Luther, Sitters, Bunker Hill, East Greenbush, Nassau and Brookville. An auto cavalcade will represent churches, societies and other organizations of the participating communities. Two musical units will play for the marchers, the Nassau Fire Company Bugle and Drum Corps and the combined East Schodack Fire Company and Junior Bands.

From the cemetery the procession will move to the Archibald Proper Monument for the presentation of colors and placing of a floral tribute. The program will close with the singing of the National Anthem.

Rev. C. M. Wittforth, pastor of the East Schodack Lutheran Church, is chairman of the general committee.
