Drumm Cites Causes Of Schodack Tax Rate Boost

Schodack taxes will increase \$4.30 per thousand of assessed evaluation in 1971 according to the proposed budget presented at a public hearing at the Town Hall, Wednesday. The budget was presented by Supervisor Richard Drumm. He said that the increase was necessisary because of increase in costs of operation and also to a decrease in income expected from the Fenn Central Railway and the loss of certain properties along Main Street, Castleton, Despite these losses there was an increase of real estate in other parts of the town making the over-all net increase about \$100,000

With this year's proposed increase, the next tax will be \$15.80 for the Highway and affiliated expenses and \$11.70 for the General Fund.

Considerable discussion developed from questions asked by Raymond Lemka and Robert Frezon. They asked about economies that might be possible in snow removal and what restrictions in zoning might do to increase taxes Questions were also asked about the county sales tax and whether Schodack was getting its fair share.
