



500 laborers, Bielawa said, and has about 10 times the space and equipment available in Castleton. He predicted that most of the machinery in the Castleton plant will be moved to Illinois and that the empty building and grounds would be put up for sale to another manufacturing

The employees will not go with the plant for economic reasons, the manager said. Workers at the home plant will be able to take over the duties now performed in Castleton, he explained. The company is looking for work for its Agrico Farm Center employees, who are mostly machinists. in this area.
